WordPress Concepts



WordPress - Concepts

- Core software that runs the site
 - All members are WordPress users
 - Non-privileged users have no real visibility or need to be aware it is WordPress
 - Username, Email address and Password are managed by “stock” Wordpress Admin
 - All the machinery that runs the site is provided by WordPress
 - Everything is core WordPress or a WordPress plugin
 - There is no other software used or directly integrated to deliver the site
 - All this of course sits on top of standard web and database server
- WordPress stuff often talks about “Front End” and “Back End”
 - Front End means the things visible and “doable” without using the WordPress control panel
 - A key design goal was 100.0% of normal user interaction is via Front End (achieved)
 - Non-admins do not see the “WP Admin Bar” or have access to any part of the admin area
 - Backend means the WordPress admin panel
 - All wp-admin pages are like <https://www.beechaeroclub.org/wp-admin/XXXX>
 - That link can be bookmarked safely: <https://www.beechaeroclub.org/wp-admin/>
 - Admins will see the WP Admin Bar for quick access



WordPress - Role Concepts

WordPress primarily uses “Roles” for permissions

- Under the hood roles have a set of capabilities
 - Most software tests for a capability - but this is an FYI only for your needs
- We have the roles defined in 3 groups
 - Stock, Add-Ons & Custom
- All WordPress Users have a primary role and 0 or more additional roles
 - Even non-logged in users have to have a Role (again, like vBulletin)
 - Much like the vBulletin Primary and Secondary groups
- For software that only understands “stock” WordPress stuff we use “role” as a proxy for member/not-member tests
 - We use “user has role Contributor” as a test for being a member



WordPress - Roles Used

Stock Roles Used

- **Subscriber - Read Only effectively**
 - All guests and expired members are Subscribers
- **Contributor - R/O but w/comments**
 - Mostly read only but can comment on Posts
 - All current, paid members are "Contributors"
- **Author**
 - Can create posts
 - w/use f/blessed content contributors
- **Editor**
 - Author plus can edit/delete others posts
 - w/use f/blessed content editors
- **Administrator**
 - "God" Admin (me for now)

Custom/Extra Roles

- **Forum Roles**
 - *Understood by BuddyPress and (indirectly) forums*
 - **Spectator**
 - Read-only for guests
 - **Participant**
 - Default read all/post/edit own
 - **Moderator**
 - Edit/Delete/Moderate/Ban others posts
- **Limited Admin Roles**
 - **Super Editor**
 - Extra access to theme and visual settings
 - For Rick & future web designers
 - **Member Admin**
 - Access to user and membership areas
 - Both of these roles also
 - have all Editor abilities
 - are also made Forum Moderators



WordPress - Post Concepts & Content

In WordPress most things are some kind of “post”

- Standard post types:
 - **Posts** are (normally) the most used post type
 - Used for editorial content and (by default) can be commented on
 - Screwing up a post will generally just screw up that post
 - All the former (and most future) “Articles” will be **posts**
 - **Pages** are used for custom content (including “active” content)
 - Pages can be highly customized and include active programming
 - Some pages are still really just content but with more formatting ability
 - Most of the static content linked from the “top” menu is a **page**
 - But some pages can screw up large swaths of the website
 - Example: The entire Forum area in all views is rendered on a single page



WordPress - Custom and Non-Post Data

- Custom post types are often used for other content
 - Sometimes they still act (and can be partially edited) like post:
 - Events & Classifieds are custom post types that still act a lot like a standard post
 - Sometimes they are really only used under the hood
 - Much of MemberPress (rules, memberships, groups and more) are custom post types
 - Mostly invisible and/or can only be edited through custom pages
- More plugins are using custom database tables
 - “Everything is a post” is convenient from a programming view
 - But can be horrible from a database performance perspective
- Non-Post data (using custom database tables)
 - Forums
 - Photo Albums
 - File Library (aka Downloads)
- *Some custom post types and all non-post data is invisible to “stock” WordPress search*



WordPress - Media Library

WordPress has a common “Media Library” for file assets (images/attachments)

- Used for all images and attachments displayed by anything that is any type of post
- Sometimes used under the hood from Front End
 - Classifieds and Events
- Is used explicitly for all pages and posts
 - Ergo: Author and higher roles have media library access on “back end”
- Media library is global
 - So deleting something from the media library will break all references to that something
 - Or you can get 25 copies of the same thing on 25 posts because it gets reuploaded
 - We are using some conventions and a plugin to help manage this - but it often becomes a garbage can
 - No easy way to find if an item is used except via database search - and that is not 100%
 - This is also part of why we do not provide “Author” access to membership by default
- Things that are not posts do not use the media library at all
 - Forum post attachments
 - Download/File library
 - Photo Gallery



Other Key Software



Key Software - MemberPress

- Membership software
 - Handles payments, memberships and expiration
 - Also manages access (directly or indirectly) to Paid/Open areas of website via “Rules”
 - Except forums...
 - **Everything** that allows membership access to the website flows from MemberPress
 - Do not manually fix anything else until you verify MemberPress status is correct
 - 99% of the time fixing MemberPress will fix that
 - In fact so far I have found 0 other problems independently related to Membership
 - In our setup MemberPress also overrides **all** there registration/signup pages
 - This allows seamless single page + payment signup flow
 - MemberPress can set WordPress roles and BuddyPress groups based on membership
 - More on this in a bit - but this is how all the member site access is implemented
 - Admin access is separate and done manually per-user
 - *MemberPress also supports extended custom profile fields - not used*



Key Software - BuddyPress

- BuddyPress provides “social” features to WordPress
 - In our site BuddyPress is “built-in” to BuddyBoss theme but effectively the same
- Features of BuddyPress
 - Private Messages
 - Groups - Currently only using two fixed groups
 - BAC Members (current members)
 - BAC Former Members (expired members)
 - MemberPress manages this automatically for us based on membership status
 - Some things understand BuddyPress groups
 - So we use “BAC Members” for this
 - *Could enable custom groups but disabled for now*
 - Extended User Profiles
 - All fields except username and email are BuddyPress extended profile fields (xprofile)
 - Extended activity feed (our “What’s New” page is really this feed)
 - *Friends - Disabled*



Simple:Press - Forums

- Our Forum Software is Simple:Press
 - All forum functionality is rendered on a single page (**forum**)
 - Simple:Press implements it's own permissions
 - So it is not protected by a MemberPress rule
 - Lets us provide selective read access for guests and post access for Former Members
 - Specific forums only
 - Read only Fly-Ins & Mail Lists forums
 - Plus post access to Website Issues for Former Members
 - That way we keep that forum open to people with renewal issues
 - Same model as the “old” site
 - Data lives outside of WordPress posts
 - Invisible to WordPress admin pages except the Forum pages
 - Invisible to stock WordPress search
 - Does **not** use the WordPress media library



Key Software - Beaver Builder

Two Parts

- Both support enhanced editing and layout including “active” components
- Visual Page Editor
 - Provides enhanced abilities for the content area of pages
 - Most but not all of our pages use Beaver Builder
 - Content from Beaver Builder is invisible to stock editor
 - There is dummy content put into the normal page content strictly for search
- Beaver Themer
 - Provides enhanced abilities for other building blocks
 - Drop in blocks for use pages
 - Header/Footer
- In both cases Beaver can use WordPress user role or MemberPress membership
 - To show varying content for different users
 - Join versus Renew buttons
 - Member versus non-member content
 - In the header and a few of the landing pages



Membership Functions



MemberPress - Memberships

- We have three **membership** types
- These are linked into a membership **group**
 - Poor choice of name - totally different than other group types
 - People can only have one membership in a group active at the same time
 - Memberpress views these as a hierarchy with a partial upgrade/downgrade relationship
- **BAC Member - Single Pay and Auto Renewal**
 - These have to be separate due to MemberPress not allowing mixing auto-subscribe and single pay on a single membership
 - There's some nuances when members switch from Auto-Pay to Single-Payment
 - Separate slide on this
- **BAC Former Member**
 - This is set as the “default” that members revert to when they expire
 - Only someone who once was really a paid member will become a Former Member



MemberPress - Site Access

- Membership access flows from MemberPress
 - When a user becomes a paid member (Single Pay or Auto-Renewal member)
 - MemberPress automatically
 - Changes their primary WordPress role from **Subscriber** -> **Contributor**
 - Adds a secondary role of **Participant**
 - Adds them to the BuddyPress **BAC Members** BuddyPress Group
 - SimplePress
 - Puts user into the **BAC Members** forum group b/o WordPress role as **Contributor**
 - When a user expires
 - MemberPress automatically
 - Gives them a lifetime free membership as a **BAC Former Member**
 - Removes them from **BAC Members** BuddyPress Group
 - Adds them to the **BAC Former Members** BuddyPress Group
 - Changes their primary WordPress role from **Contributor** -> **Subscriber**
 - SimplePress
 - Puts user into Guests forum group when b/o WordPress role is **Subscriber**



MemberPress - Site Access Rules

- Other site areas
 - MemberPress outright blocks all access to member-content to non-current members
 - Via Memberpress **rules**
 - Most member content is <https://www.beechaeroclub.org/member-content/XXXX>
 - Things we want to be public cannot be under /member-content/XXX
 - Forums, Events and Classifieds live on their own at the “top”
 - Some specific rules for Events and Classifieds
 - Public can view/read but only members can get at pages to edit/create/delete
 - For now all post content is member only
 - Will need to tweak this in the future for any articles we want to be public
 - For now the “new” visitor content is in pages
 - the “post” (aka article) version of this content is out of date and superseded
 - Except Forums as previously noted implements its own access
 - Basically provides and enforces group based access per-forum



Membership Payment Flows



MemberPress - Payment Concepts

MemberShip flows from payment information

- Subscription - Top level object - a Membership for a user
 - A subscription is active or not - it does not have a date - each active user in a membership has an active one
 - MemberPress views these as recurring or non-recurring
 - In the non-recurring case they may only last a year and instead have a new one created
 - Depends on payment timing (before or after expiration)
- Transaction - A single instance of a payment
 - Transaction has a price, membership and start and end date
 - In the case of PayPal - MemberPress transaction ID is the PayPal transaction ID
- Subscriptions have one or more transactions
 - Recurring (autopay) get associated with Subscriptions and and ID from PayPal
 - Comes from PayPal
 - Stays consistent year over unless there is a break in renewal (or sometimes from PayPal changes)
- Transactions will create a new subscription:
 - if they don't/can't match an existing subscription
 - Most single pay transactions create a new subscription with a new ID
- Transactions and subscriptions have a workflow in MemberPress even if non-PayPal



MemberPress - Rules for Admins

It All Flows From a Transaction...

- Unlike the old site you must grant membership by creating or extending a transaction
 - In almost all cases creating a new transaction is the correct thing to do unless you really are fixing a transaction
 - **Never** edit a PayPal transaction or refund/cancel/reversal handling will fail (and auto-renewals may fail)
- You cannot just grant membership - you **have** to create a transaction that causes MemberPress to record a membership
- You can't do it any other way - except:
 - You could edit the roles and groups by hand - **but do not do this** - you **will** screw all kinds of processing up
 - The old site had the same problem but it wasn't quite as bad
 - This a big part of why our old payment data was such a mess in some places
 - Expiration in particular will not happen and users won't be able to self-renew
- MemberPress strongly tracks payment information per-transaction, this allows and/or will allow
 - MemberPress to provide basic Income and Refund reporting
 - Strong reconciliation between the Website, PayPal and "the books"
 - Certainly between the Website and PayPal - and even semi-automatically
 - **The transaction history going forward will include all payments even if not PayPal**
- MemberPress has intrinsic understanding of things like payments, cancellations and refunds
 - Subscriptions get created or cancelled - Transactions can be payments or refunds
 - Just like PayPal and accounting a payment followed by a refund is **two** transactions (a payment and a refund)
- Transactions have a default price but that price can be edited
 - Ergo - discounted or free memberships should set the price to match (\$0 in most of those cases)



Payment Flow - PayPal - Signup

- MemberPress sends the user to PayPal but does not create a pending transaction yet
 - Ergo a user that goes to PayPal and does not complete a payment has no record
- User completes transaction and can elect to return to website
 - That return includes a Transaction ID
 - PayPal also separately calls the website via the **IPN Gateway**
 - The log of IPN calls is visible in PayPal as well - old site did not support IPN
 - Normally the return status has a **pending** status
- PayPal at that time or return or sometimes later
 - If successful - Sends a payment **complete** status via the IPN Gateway
 - This can “beat” the member returning to the site, MemberPress DTRT
 - MemberPress does it's thing
- If failed - Sends a payment **failed** status
 - Will then show as a failed payment with \$0 credit
- If later reversed - sends a payment **reversed** status
 - MemberPress shows two transaction - \$50 **payment** and \$50 **reversal**



PayPal - Auto-Renewal/Refunds/Specials

- PayPal calls MemberPress via IPN gateway with the payment
 - If MemberPress matches Subscription ID creates a new transaction for 1 year renewal
- If user cancels subscription
 - PayPal calls sends notification via IPN Gateway for cancellation of subscription
 - MemberPress (and most software) ignores this notification
 - If a refund is requested (separate action in PayPal)
 - PayPal sends notification via IPN Gateway of transaction reversal
- If we select refunding the transaction in MemberPress
 - MemberPress calls PayPal with a refund request
 - **This is different - you no longer have to go to PayPal to do the refund**
- **In all cases if there is a refund, failure or cancellation**
 - MemberPress revokes the membership and adjust the transaction and subscription
- If all cases you want to comp a membership (full or partial)
 - You have to create a **new** transaction
 - Set it to \$0 so the cost accounting is correct



PayPal - Manual Transaction Flow

- Member selects the Check/Money Order/Other Payment Option
- MemberPress creates a non-recurring **pending** transaction
- When we receive payment
 - If there is a pending payment we simply set the transaction to **complete** and Save
 - It's easy to search for all pending transactions or all transactions for a user to find
 - If the user paid for multiple years adjust amount and dates as well before doing Save
 - MemberPress will do the rest for us
- If we got a blind check (user did not go through website first)
 - Create a new transaction as appropriate
 - Memberpress will default to 1 year from current date
 - Amount and time can be adjusted to match payment
 - Select a **complete** status and Save
 - MemberPress will again do the rest for us
- In both cases
 - We can elect to have MemberPress send a PDF receipt
- In all case the user can get self service a PDF receipt in their profile



PayPal - Manual Transaction Flow

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Manual Transaction Refund/Failure

- Find Corresponding Transaction
 - If PayPal select the transaction that you wish to refund/cancel
 - If manual or double payment select the duplicate you wish to refund/cancel
 - In most cases select the newest transaction
 - In a mixed manual/PayPal case select based on whether you want to trigger a PayPal refund
 - In a double pay PayPal case with a single pay and PayPal auto-renewal
 - refund the single-pay transaction or you may break the auto-renewal
- Adjust Status and save
 - If refunding money select **Refund**
 - Note if a PayPal transaction this will trigger a PayPal refund
 - If not PayPal will have to send refund or manually push money from PayPal
 - If failed payment (returned check, etc) select **Failed**
- If you refunded the transaction that is current transaction for the subscription MemberPress will revoke membership
 - In a duplicate payment case you may need to restore membership
 - You can select the other non-refunded transaction
 - Select **pending** and save
 - Edit again and select **complete** and save (you may need to adjust dates depending on timing)
 - This will re-initialize membership without creating yet another duplicate membership
 - This is the one thing you can safely do to edit a PayPal transaction



Other Adjustments and Notes

- Comped (\$0) extension to existing subscription
 - It's okay to edit the current transaction and extend the date (be sure to not change amount)
- Comped extension to expired subscription
 - It's okay to edit the most recent transaction and extend the date (be sure to not change amount)
 - If long expired consider creating a new transaction instead so membership tenure data stays "more" correct
- If creating a new comped or discounted transaction for any term
 - Adjust amount to \$0 or other correct amount
 - Edit term appropriately
- If awarding a lifetime subscription for \$0 or other amount
 - Create a new transaction
 - Click the "Lifetime" button by expiration
 - Adjust amount to appropriate amount
 - This will clear the expiration and treat it as a lifetime subscription
- Always remember subscriptions have to be saved after editing
